We are proud to have our first female Trail Boss, Melody Page and first female Assistant Trail Boss, Lea Fistein. Melody has been a very important part of our organization for many years. Melody is a breast cancer survivor and has carried our "Breast Cancer Awareness" flag in the parade many times. Lea has also rode with us for many years. She has been an excellent scout and has also been a part of our honor guard team. We are excited to have them both leading the way.

Texas Cattlemen's Trail Ride dedicates it's time and ride to the preservation of Youth and Education.

Our color guard includes the American Flag, Texas Flag, Breast Cancer Awareness Flag, POW, and our Texas Cattlemen's Trail Ride Association Flag.

Texas Cattlemen's make sure to stop at schools along the way to show and teach the children about the Western Heritage way. On Thursday February 22nd Texas Cattlemen's stops at Houston Northwest Church School: where the trail ride riders are treated to lunch and dessert. The children of the school also perform a skit for the riders and provide treats for the horses.

Willie Nelson Jr aka Billy Nelson started his trail riding in 1955 when he was 17 years old. Billy Nelson started with Salt Grass when there was only 1 wagon (belonging to Mr. Marks) and just a handful of riders. Back then, the riders had to carry everything they need in their saddlebags. It only took one time to get Billy hooked from there he became member of Sam Houston Trail Ride where he introduced his 6 children to the riding experience. Two have served on committees for the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo (Keith Nelson Lifetime Committeemen "Calf Scramble Committee" and Jason Nelson "Trail Ride Committee"). Billy served, as Trail Boss for Sam Houston Trail

Ride in the early 1970's believed it was 1972, 1973, and 1974. Soon after having the chance to serve as trail Boss, he was able to join the Trail Ride Committee (1975). After several years of enjoying Sam Houston Trail Ride Billy decided to start a smaller, family ride which is now known as the Texas Cattlemen's Trail Ride Association. At a young age of 86 he is still a Life Time Committeeman (Trail Ride Committee) and one of the only founders of Texas Cattlemen's Trail Ride who is still participating and not watching from Heaven.

We continue to honor our military service members that are still unaccounted for. We will wear back western shirts with the POW/MIA (Prisoner of war, missing in action) emblem. Malcolm Cox one of our former Tail Bosses, was a Vietnam Combat Veteran and was very passionate and involved with the POW/MIA efforts. Alex Henson wagon #2 driver served for 9 years in the United States Navy as a Sea Bee. There are thousands of service members from the previous wars that are still unaccounted for. We have carried a list of the Vietnam War veterans names still unaccounted for, from the state of Texas with us throughout our ride. Our mission is to let the families of those veterans and the public know they are not forgotten.

Texas Cattlemen's also continues to promote breast cancer awareness. Thursday, February 22nd is our "Tough Enough to Wear Pink" day. Our riders wear pink to show support for those who have been affected by breast cancer.

History

Four friends formed the Texas Cattlemen's Trail Ride Association to promote youth and education through the show. Willie "Billy Nelson Jr", Bobby Laird, Lyndall Tutt, and Nelson MacKenroth. Billy being the only founder left to keep the tradition going. Floyd Stewart and Keith Nelson are two of the original Board of Directors who still participate with Texas Cattlemen's Trail Ride.

Texas Cattlemen's Trail Ride will carry the US Flag honoring the Veteran, the POW Flag t honor those currently held captive and who have perished while in captivity, and the Breast Cancer Awareness Flag in support of those who have been affected by breast cancer.

The Texas Cattlemen's Trail Ride's goal is safety, having fun, humane treatment of animals, and upholding the image and values of the Western Heritage.
