Who Are We?

The Facility Services Committee is comprised of teams that maintain and clean the facilities and grounds. We supervise cleaning staff and contractors to maintain the Show grounds, including the Livestock Show, Horse Show and carnival. The members work closely with the Buildings and Grounds Department to perform daily, routine responsibilities to ensure the facilities and grounds are clean and presentable for the public and exhibitors, as well as the scheduling and execution of minor/major move-ins of Livestock and Horse Shows. Each year this committee saves the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo thousands of dollars which can be diverted back into scholarships.

Where Did We Come From?

Before 1994, Astrodome USA was paid by the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo to keep the grounds clean and maintained. In 1994, Rodeo executives sent out a letter to volunteers requesting help. A group of 54 volunteers lead by Tom Glazier, manager, assisted by Wendell Chance, Mike Glasco, Melinda Searcy and Richard Wachel, coordinated the cleanup of the grounds outside as well as the Astro Hall and Astro Arena. In 1997, "The Outhouse Gang" became an official committee. In 1998, Richard Wachel came up with an idea for a "team concept." Committee members were now able to choose a morning, afternoon, or evening team that fit their schedule. They were able to work 6 shifts with the same committee members, led by a team captain. In 2000, the committee officially changed its name to the "Facility Services Committee."



What Do I Do to Join?

To become a member of the Facility Services Committee, applicants must fulfill the following requirements:

- Have a Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo membership (membership number must be provided).
- Have a current Indemnification form completed, signed and on file with the Rodeo.
- Add yourself to the Facility Services Committee wait list.
- Be able to work a minimum of six shifts on a predetermined team schedule.
- The applicant must be able to supervise and execute tasks as efficiently and effectively as possible with pre-assigned contract labor crews in designated areas.
