



Education Centers

Our education centers are at the forefront of helping disadvantaged students across the United States and Puerto Rico.



LNESC has developed a program model that services disadvantaged students at all stages of educational development. LNESC develops and delivers a range of services at the elementary, middle, and high school levels.





Since 1973 LNESC has awarded over \$28 million in scholarships through the LULAC National **Scholarship Fund and** its specialized scholarships

LULAC National Scholarship Fund (LNSF)



LNESC and LULAC established the LULAC National Scholarship Fund (LNSF) to help youth in underserved communities make the dream of college enrollment a reality. LNSF is a unique partnership between grassroots advocates and corporations that fund educational opportunities for deserving youth across the U.S. Every dollar raised by local LULAC Councils is matched by corporate partners secured by LNESC, increasing the amount given in both the council and corporate names. This model results in a true grassroots/corporate partnership for the empowerment of the Latino community. Former recipients of LNSF scholarships are now leaders in fields of business, science, government, and education. A rigorous selection process assures the expectation that future recipients will demonstrate the same level of excellence.

ExxonMobil Engineering Scholarship has awarded over 100 students more than \$350,000 since 2014

The ExxonMobil Engineering Scholarship Program recognizes outstanding Hispanic college freshman who plan to pursue a degree in engineering at U.S. post-secondary institutions. Sponsored by the Exxon Mobil Corporation, LNESC awards one (1) national scholarship of \$20,000, paid over four years, and twelve (12) \$2,000 local scholarships to qualified high school seniors.



Ford Driving Dreams Scholarship Has awarded more than 1,450 students over \$2,914,00 since 2016



The Ford Driving Dreams Scholarship Program is intended to assist and encourage high school seniors from the North Texas, Houston, and San Antonio areas to pursue a degree at U.S. post-secondary institutions. The Ford Driving Dreams Scholarship Program is sponsored by Ford Motor Company Fund and administered by the LULAC National Educational Service Centers (LNESC).

The Ford Driving Dreams Scholarship Program awards \$2,000 scholarships to qualified high school seniors. Applicants must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale or the equivalent, and students must have scored 20 or higher on the ACT test, or 1050 or higher on the SAT, and plan to enroll full-time in an accredited college or university.

NBCUniversal/LNESC Scholarship has awarded 70 students \$350,000 since 2015

The NBCUniversal/LNESC Scholarship Program is intended to assist and encourage outstanding undergraduate Latino students attending a U.S. post-secondary institution with an interest in the media and entertainment industry. The Program awards ten (10) \$5,000 national scholarships to qualified rising sophomores and juniors and is sponsored by NBCUniversal and administered by the LULAC National Educational Service Centers (LNESC).





LNESC Emergency Scholarship Fund has awarded over 190 students more than \$94,000 since 2015

The LNESC Emergency Scholarship Fund is a joint partnership between LNESC & Macy's to provide financial resources to deserving students facing economic hardship and **immediate** monetary need that, if not met, could result in an inability to complete classes or a degree program.

Emergency financial need resulting from the following will qualify students for funding:

- •change in family income/support
- •loss of job
- death of an immediate family member
- natural disaster
- •pending eviction or home foreclosure
- burglary
- •fire

*Poor financial choices do not constitute a emergency financial need (e.g. credit card debit, poor use of financial aid funding, personal loans to family or friends).

LNESC Emergency Scholarships are non-renewable and applicants cannot be recipients of other LULAC National Educational Service Centers (LNESC) Scholarships at the time of application. Award amounts vary based on need, but should not exceed \$500 due to an overwhelming number of applicants.



Washington Youth Leadership Seminar

The Washington Youth Leadership Seminar (WYLS) is LNESC's annual leadership development program that brings together approximately 50+ future rising Latino leaders from across the U.S. and Puerto Rico to Washington, DC and immerses them in a specific public policy area. Students undergo leadership training, advocacy training, and peer bonding exercises, resulting in a tightknit group of leaders engaged and energized to make a difference in the Latino community.

WYLS is a life-changing opportunity for Latino high school students in our nation's most underserved communities to meet first-hand with the country's most influential decision makers. The seminar includes a Capitol Hill Day whereby the newly trained student advocates meet with Members of Congress and discuss the changes they want to see made for their communities. While in the nation's Capital, students also work with leaders from corporate America and other public and private institutions to provide input on issues important to the Latino community.
