Achievement Scholarship

In 2024, The Houston Livestock Show and RodeoTM will award \$1,200,000 in Achievement Scholarships to current Rodeo Scholars who have achieved academic excellence in their college career.

The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo's Educational Programs are a significant part of the Show's goals of benefiting youth, supporting education, and facilitating better agricultural practices through exhibitions and presentation. All recipients of Show scholarships must demonstrate academic potential, citizenship/leadership, financial need, and they must attend a not-for-profit Texas college or university.

Scholarship Funding

Scholarships payments are for \$4,000 each semester and are awarded based on the number of semesters remaining towards completing an <u>undergraduate degree</u>. Funding may not be utilized for summer school or graduate school. Also, double payments are not available for achievement scholarship funding. If you were previously awarded an Achievement scholarship, you are not eligible to apply for more funding.

2022 Scholarship Recipients – up to \$16,000, payable for up to two years.

2021 Scholarship Recipients – up to \$8,000, payable for up to one year.

2020 Scholarship Recipients – up to \$4,000, payable for one semester.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible to apply for, or to be awarded, an Achievement Scholarship, an applicant must:

- 1. Attend a not-for-profit Texas college or university (accredited by The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges).
- 2. Be classified as a college junior (60 or more completed hours) or senior (90 or more completed hours) by the conclusion of the Spring 2024 semester. Students must have completed a minimum of **four** college semesters since high school graduation by the conclusion of the Spring 2024 semester. **Students awarded a Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Scholarship in 2023 are not eligible.**
- 3. Have a **cumulative GPA of 3.0** or higher at the conclusion of the Spring 2024 semester. A student's cumulative GPA will be taken from the transcript of the university where the Spring 2024 disbursement was sent.
- 4. Must be attending or transferring to a four-year university for the Fall 2024 semester.
- 5. A recipient of any Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Scholarship <u>may not receive</u> more than \$110,000 in funding from financial aid, grants, or any other scholarships for

the four-year term of an undergraduate degree. This does not include the Show Scholarship, loans, or Federal Work Study.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Application Process

- a. Complete and submit the online application prior to the deadline.
 - Eligible students will receive an email from the Educational Programs department with the link to the application once it is available on May 9, 2024. Once you begin the application, you may access your saved work via your Kaleidoscope account. Once your submission is made, you cannot make edits to the application.
- b. Applicants are required to submit the following forms through the online application process.
 - Upload and submit a copy of an official transcript that includes all academic semester information, including final Spring 2024 grade information.
 Transcripts that are mailed or emailed to the Educational Programs office will not be accepted. The transcript you upload for the Achievement application does not count towards the grade verification process for the Spring 2024 semester. All students will need to upload their academic transcript in the Gradebooks section of Kaleidoscope by June 30th for Spring semester grade verification.
 - Upload and submit *Financial Aid Package/Award Letters* from the institutions you have attended. Students can provide a screenshot or scan from the school's website or provide an award letter from the school for each year in which they have been enrolled. Applicants are required to submit as least two years (four semesters) of financial aid.
- c. Applicants are required to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). For the 2024 application cycle, students may submit one of the following documents:
 - A finalized FAFSA Submission Summary showing the finalized Student Aid Index (SAI)
 - A copy of the submission confirmation email showing the estimated SAI
 - If the applicant is unable to provide either the final FSS or submission confirmation because of issues with the new FAFSA release, they may submit a PDF copy of their results from the Federal Student Aid Estimator Tool.
- d. Please do not include documents that are not required (ie: letters of recommendation, additional essays, etc.) as they will be discarded.

2. Eligibility

- a. The Achievement Scholarship application process is only available online through Kaleidoscope.
- b. In order to apply, students must be ACTIVE Show scholars. The application will not be available for any student that has received a probationary status or other

academic restrictions. In addition, if a student is not up to date in grade reporting requirements, the application will not be available to them.

SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINES AND IMPORTANT DATES

It is the sole responsibility of each applicant to be aware of all dates and deadlines.

The Show will not accept or consider any incomplete or late applications, <u>no exceptions will</u> be made.

EVALUATION PROCEDURE

All completed applications will be reviewed and evaluated by a committee of judges selected by the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. Incomplete and non-qualifying applications will not be considered.

NOTIFICATION OF RECIPIENTS

Final approval and notification of each scholarship recipient will be made by the Show's Office of Educational Programs towards the beginning of August 2024. All applicants will be notified via email if they are awarded a scholarship or not. Winners will be required to complete an acceptance form before payment can be made to your institution.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Applications and supporting documentation become property of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo has the right to refuse and/or retract any scholarship application or scholarship award during the judging, awarding or post awarding process. Refusal/retraction can be based on, but not limited to, unfactual and incorrect information provided in the application or failure to meet any of the requirements.
