MEDIA CREDENTIAL PICKUP

- A valid photo ID and business identification card/media pass will be required to pick up credentials.
- Individuals are required to sign for their credentials. A credentialed representative may pick up all credentials for his/her staff; this individual is responsible for the credentials once he/she has signed for them.

POLICY

Media accreditation is reserved for reporters, writers, videographers, producers and photographers who work for established media outlets. Media credentials will be issued to members of the working media, including production personnel, in the radio, newspaper, digital, magazine and television industries assigned to cover the Houston Livestock Show and RodeoTM.

Freelancers, photographers and bloggers applying for accreditation must provide, if requested, a letter of assignment from an official publisher or editor with clear assignment details.



MEDIA RELATIONS MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All outlets must provide a detailed explanation of planned coverage. While all applications will be reviewed and considered, the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo reserves the right to deny any media accreditation application. The full Media Credential Policy can be reviewed at rodeohouston.com/media.

CREDENTIAL USAGE

Media credentials must be always worn. Accredited media must cooperate with the procedures at the gates and security checkpoints at NRG Park.

- Credentials are issued specifically for the person who was approved through the media accreditation process, are non-transferable, and may not be given or loaned to another person for any reason.
- Any media outlet that needs to change the name(s) of its credentialed staff must submit a written request via email to media@rodeohouston.com.
- Lost or stolen media credentials must be immediately reported to the Media Center. Credentials will be canceled, and a replacement credential may be issued.
- Media credentials provide access onto the Rodeo grounds, the Media Center and into the Press Box at NRG Stadium.
 - The Press Box must be accessed through the West Club Lobby, located on Kirby Dr.
 - Media credentials do not provide seating at the rodeo/concert in NRG Stadium.
 - Media credentials do not provide access to any other area of NRG Stadium.



MEDIA CREDENTIALS

- Arrangements must be requested and approved in advance with the Communications Department to gain access to other areas of NRG Stadium, including rodeo/concert photography.
- Requests will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis and should be sent via email to media@rodeohouston.com.
- Misuse of a media credential may result in the immediate revoking of the credential, removal from the media areas and loss of future credential privileges for his/her organization.
- The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo reserves the right to revoke credential privileges for any reason.

AGREEMENT FOR USE OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

The Accredited Media agrees to abide by the policies and procedures set forth by the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. All materials obtained pursuant to 2025 media accreditation will be used for legitimate news coverage only.

Any secondary or non-editorial commercial use of any **photographs**, **video**, **audio** or **depictions** of any **activities** at the Rodeo, recorded by any process and on whatever medium, March 4-23, 2025, is prohibited without prior consent of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo.

The Accredited Media agrees that i) photographs, video, audio, or other depictions of any activities at the Rodeo, recorded by any process and on whatever medium, will not be used for any purpose other than for the Accredited Media and ii) it will respect and protect the intellectual property rights of contestants, exhibitors and entertainers.

The Accredited Media agrees to use no more than 30 seconds continuous or four minutes total of moving video from any events in NRG Stadium in any two-hour period, or more than eight minutes in any six-hour period of

news broadcast. Website clips and live streaming will be limited to 30 seconds continuous moving video per individual event (concert, rodeo, etc.).

MEDIA RELATIONS MEDIA PARKING

A **limited** number of permit parking passes are allocated to designated media outlets, with priority given to local print and broadcast outlets who are on-site covering the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo for the duration of the Rodeo.

The media outlet is responsible for distributing the parking passes to their staff before arriving on-site to cover the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. Additional parking pass requests will not be honored.

Purple Hangtag: The Purple Lot is located off McNee St. (Gate 15)

Orange Hangtag: The Orange hangtag is reserved for broadcast media outlets/broadcast vehicles only. The Orange Lot is located at NRG Parkway East (Gate 2) off Fannin St. Park in Lot 6 on the East side of NRG Center.

News Media Street Pass: Street Pass parking privileges are granted only to broadcast media outlets with occupied vehicles during news transmitting activities (i.e. a live broadcast). The vehicle has street parking privileges in all parking lots and drive areas in NRG Park, when engaged in a live broadcast. The Street Pass allows access to Gate 12 (North Stadium) or Gate 2 (Fannin St.) only. (**Note:** All live trucks must be cleared in advance by the Media team).

LOCATION

NRG Stadium, 8th Floor

- The Press Box is located on the eighth level of the west side of NRG Stadium, along Kirby Drive.
- > Enter NRG Stadium through the West VIP Lobby, located on Kirby Drive. Take the elevator to the 8th level.
- Note: You must enter through the West VIP Lobby, as your media credential will not allow you to access NRG Stadium via other entry points.

GUIDELINES

- Access to the Press Box requires media credentials unless you are a guest of an individual who is credentialed.

- Credentials are issued specifically for the person who was approved through the media accreditation process, are non-transferable, and may not be given or loaned to another person for any reason.

Guidelines in NRG Stadium

PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO GUIDELINES IN NRG STADIUM

Filming of the rodeo and concerts is strictly prohibited.

RODEO FOOTAGE

- A live media feed of the rodeo action is available each night of the rodeo. For questions regarding access to the live media feed, please contact media@rodeohouston.com.
- > Specific video footage may also be available to credentialed media outlets. Requests must be submitted via the online Video Footage Request Form at rodeohouston.com/media.

CONCERT FOOTAGE AND PHOTOGRAPHY

- Approximately two minutes of the concert will be streamed via the live media feed after the rodeo concludes, to be credited to the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. Media outlets may only use 30 seconds of this concert footage for any broadcast coverage. Media outlets that violate this policy and use more than 30 seconds of concert footage may be denied future access. Note: Concert footage availability is dependent on individual artist approval.
- > Photography during the concert is limited. Only credentialed photographers granted **prior approval** through the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo on behalf of the artist's management and/or publicist will be granted access.



- Approved photographers must follow the guidelines outlined by the artist's management team, including photography releases, if required.
- Photo regulations vary by each artist and are typically limited to one song. Instructions will be provided in advance to approved photographers by the Rodeo's Media Coordinators.
- To request approval to photograph concerts, email media@rodeohouston.com.
- Include name of credentialed photographer, cell phone, email, media outlet and potential run date. Requests must be submitted at least 48 hours in advance of the concert.
- The Rodeo can provide approved photos following the performance, upon request, to be credited to the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. Requests should be sent via email to media@rodeohouston.com.





Guidelines in Carnival

Photography and filming of the Carnival, presented by First Community, is permitted, but the Media team **must be notified in advance.** Please notify the Media team via phone or email if you plan to take photos or film inside the Carnival to avoid any delays or disruption.

BROADCAST MEDIA SHOOTING GUIDELINES

All working broadcast media must inform the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo media team when they are on property (NRG Park). The Rodeo media team will inform security and Rodeo staff. This will alleviate any issues for crews while filming during the event.

RODEO ESCORT REQUIRED ON GROUNDS:

- > A live shot with a live interview
- Interviewing any Rodeo staff
- > Interviewing children (under 16)

ESCORT NOT REQUIRED ON GROUNDS:

- Live shot without any live interviews Must still inform media team about topic and location for livestock. Escort is preferred.
- > Collecting B-ROLL
- > Interviewing MOS (not live)
- > Editing or any work-related activities aside from videography
- The Rodeo Media team needs to be notified where broadcast media will be located on the grounds if they are gathering B-ROLL or interviewing MOS (i.e. Carnival area, NRG Center, NRG Arena etc.) This way the media team can inform staff and security in that area. ECONOMIC IMPACT TO GREATER HOUSTON

The 2024 Rodeo generated a total economic impact of \$326 million and total economic activity of \$597 million in Greater Houston, according to the Rodeo's 2024 Economic Impact Study, conducted by Economics Analytics Consulting, LLC. That is a 43% increase of economic impact and a 53% increase in economic activity compared to 2019.

- > Total Economic Impact: \$326 million
- > Total Economic Activity: \$597 million

For comparison:

- The College Football Playoffs in Houston had a total economic impact of \$200M.
- > The Final Four in Houston had a total economic impact of \$270M.
- The total number of direct jobs (3,538) is also equivalent to the graduating class at Rice University.

Economic impact measures the economic effects of new spending in Greater Houston generated by visitors attending the 2024 Rodeo, while the economic activity provides a measure of the full economic power of the Rodeo by quantifying the total spending in Greater Houston generated by everyone who attends.

RODEOHOUSTON* HALL OF FAME

Leon Coffee is the sole inductee for the second class of the Hall of Fame. Last year, Coffee rolled his barrel out for the last time at RODEOHOUSTON marking the end of an era, but not his rodeo legacy. In 2025, Coffee will trade the arena floor for the fan zone and stands, bringing his legendary charm and wit to entertain guests in new ways. His infectious spirit and larger-than-life personality will continue to be a hallmark of the event, ensuring that Coffee remains an integral part of the RODEOHOUSTON experience.

The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo announced the RODEOHOUSTON Hall of Fame and the inaugural class of 2024. Three individuals were inducted during the RODEOHOUSTON finals in 2024; Mike Cervi, Charmayne James and Bob Tallman.

The RODEOHOUSTON Hall of Fame will recognize individuals and animals for their impact on the success and longevity of the Rodeo. Future honorees will include past and present Rodeo contractor personnel, contestants, stock and stock contractors. A temporary display can be seen inside NRG Stadium for fans to visit throughout the 20-day event. A permanent display is on the second floor of NRG Center and highlights all Hall of Fame inductees. Coffee will be inducted to the Hall of Fame on the first Sunday of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo.

RODEOHOUSTON PURSE INCREASE

Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo officials announced the purse payout for RODEOHOUSTON's 2025 Rodeo will increase by \$355,500, making the total payout \$2,533,500. Responding to valuable athlete feedback, increasing the total purse to \$2.5 million was a decision the Rodeo was proud to make. For each of the eight events, the total payout has now increased from \$242,000 to \$281,500. The Rodeo events include tie-down roping, bareback riding, team roping, saddle bronc riding, steer wrestling, barrel racing, breakaway roping and bull riding.



There are eight Rodeo events organized into five three-day Super Series, two Semifinal rounds, two Wild Card rounds, and a Championship round. The Championship includes 10 athletes competing in each event, with the top four immediately competing in a Championship Shootout Round to determine the event champion and the now \$65,000 prize winner, a \$15,000 increase from 2024. The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo continues to be the richest regular season rodeo.

RODEOHOUSTON'S NEW BARRELMAN

John Harrison was announced in mid-October. Harrison is one of the most accomplished barrelmen in the sport, having made 13 appearances at the National Finals Rodeo (NFR) and named PRCA Clown/Barrelman of the Year in 2024, his tenth time winning the award. Harrison also took home Comedy Act of the Year for the eighth time in 2023. Originally from Soper, Oklahoma, Harrison and his family, known as "The Clown Family," among rodeo fans and professionals, now travel across the country year-round as a group. Coffee personally handpicked Harrison, expressing confidence in his ability to captivate audiences at RODEOHOUSTON.

CHAIRMAN'S PARTY DECK, PRESENTED BY AXS

Previously known as the Chairman's Club, the exclusive spot in NRG Center is being reimagined this year! The new theme of the space will be a crossover of Cowboy Disco x Rustic. There will be live entertainment before Grand Entry begins. There will also be nightly signature cocktails inspired by entertainers. Guests can enjoy all you can eat and drink.

AGVENTURE, PRESENTED BY OXY

AGVENTURE, presented by Oxy, is comprised of our soil and bee exhibits. Our bee exhibit is manned by expert beekeepers who go into detail about bees and how you can become a beekeeper! The exhibits will be transformed into an interactive and educational exhibit where children (and adults) can learn the importance of bees and soil to agriculture. The attraction will keep its familiar favorites – sunflower planting and live chats with expert beekeepers however we will be adding updated ag facts, photo opportunities, and seating for our younger attendees.

NEW ART INSTILLATION

A striking 100-foot mural by Houston-based artistic duo Made X Chilly (pronounced "Made By Chilly") will debut at this year's Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. Artists Chelsea Lemmons and Ileana Hamilton, known for their innovative multi-medium approach, will create this large-scale installation across from the popular Mutton Bustin' area near the Naomi entrance to NRG Park. The mural represents a significant addition to the Rodeo's cultural landscape and showcases local artistic talent. The mural will be unveiled on Thursday, February 27, 2025. Time is to be announced.

The Rodeo's first ever Virtual Chuck Wagon, sponsored by Verizon, is an interactive technology experience blending Western Heritage and friendly competition into a unique, real-life game simulation for a chance to win fun prizes. Participants will saddle up, hold onto the horse's reins, and be transported onto the Rodeo dirt to compete in a two-lap virtual whirlwind race. Just like the RODEOHOUSTON® Chuck Wagon Races inside NRG Stadium, sponsored wagons will be represented in the virtual experience. Riders can track the day's winning teams on a leaderboard displayed alongside the game. This will be available to all Rodeo guests free of charge and will be located in Hall C inside NRG Center.

Each Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo vice president is elected by the board of directors at the yearly Election Meeting. Elected officers shall serve for a term of one year beginning on the date of their election to office or until their respective successors are elected, unless they resign or are removed by the Board of Directors. Other than a salaried officer, no officer shall serve more than three terms in the same office, provided that, in the event that a force majeure prevents the corporation from holding the Rodeo within a calendar year, then the Executive Committee, in its sole discretion, may extend the term limit to permit an officer to serve for more than three terms in the same office.

Serving as officer in charge, each vice president handles many committee assignments. In addition to serving as a Rodeo representative, vice presidents provide vital leadership essential to keeping the Rodeo vibrant and progressive.
