1. Show Registration:

- a. The Calf Scramble Progress Show is limited to Scramble certificate winners only.

 Winners are only allowed to bring their scramble heifer or scramble steer that is registered with the Calf Scramble Office. No substitute exhibitors are allowed.
- b. Entries must be made through the entry form provided by the Scramble Office via email on September 24, 2025.
- c. There is no entry fee.

2. Animal Identification/Registration

- a. Heifers entered in this show must have an official and visible Texas Validation ear tag and electronic ID in the heifer's ear. The EID number must be on file in the Calf Scramble Office. Heifers entered must be registered in the records of their respective breed association (in the name of the exhibitor). Registration papers must be on file in the Calf Scramble Office and heifer exhibitors must present the HLSR stamped copy of the registration papers at check-in. Exhibitors are required to bring the color STAMPED COPY OF THEIR registration paper to the show ring and to keep it in their possession while exhibiting the heifer.
- b. Steers entered in this show must have an official and visible Texas Validation ear tag and electronic ID in the steer's ear. **The EID number must be on file in the Calf Scramble Office.**

3. Classes:

- a. Heifer classes will be broken by age within three divisions: American, British and Continental (no individual breed classes). **Note:** The number of classes per division will vary depending on the number of entries in each division.
- b. Steer classes will be broken into 9 classes by <u>WEIGHT ONLY</u> (no breed or division classification will occur.)

4. Animal Health Regulations:

- a. No health certificate required.
- b. A visual inspection will take place during unloading.

5. Grooming and Equipment:

- a. This is a Blow and Go Show for both heifers and steers. No grooming material, paint or dye is allowed on any animal.
- b. No clippers, which must be plugged into an electrical outlet, are allowed to be used on Scramble Breeding Beef Heifers or Scramble Steers once they arrive on Show grounds. Cordless clippers are allowed.
- c. You will be given 5 ft of stall space. All calves, tack, show boxes, etc. MUST fit inside that 5 ft space.
- d. No generators will be allowed in or around the barn.
- e. **Fans**: Freestanding fans are not allowed. Hanging fans can only be attached to the tie rails. **Please be aware that electrical outlets are extremely limited**.
- f. No stall decorations are allowed. A stall sign will be provided for you.
- g. **Bedding**: Calves will be stalled on sand unless otherwise provided by the Show. No shavings are allowed. Bedding must not be removed from stalls. Exhibitors are NOT allowed to bring in outside shavings.
- h. **Trim Chutes:** No trim chutes are allowed on grounds. Trim chutes are not provided. Trim chutes are considered to be free standing or have any of the following components: head gate, floor or wheels. Show Management reserves the right to determine what constitutes a trim chute.
- i. Dividers are allowed.
- 6. Animal Handling: Heifers and steers that are unruly or require handling by more than one person will be disqualified. Nose leads are permitted during showing. Only Show officials will be allowed to assist exhibitors during the judging.
- 7. Animal Handling Devices: Show Management or Committee Leadership/Ring Stewards reserve the right to decide what constitutes acceptable show equipment and how the equipment is being used by the exhibitor. **Cable halters are prohibited**.

8. Unethical Fitting: Unethical fitting means any alteration of the natural appearance, conformation, musculature, or weight of an animal by any unnatural means. Such alterations do not include common and accepted animal husbandry practices. Animals showing any signs of being unethically fitted will be subject to disqualification.

Examples of unethical fitting include, but are not limited to the following:

- application of any substance to any part of the animal's body, unless specifically allowed in the department rules of that species; injection, drenching or application of any substance per rectum is prohibited
- use of injections
- draining of fluids
- bruising
- feeding of material not conducive to the health of the animal, safety of food or marketability of its carcass
- surgical alterations
- artificially filling animals by stomach pumping or airing injections
- Alternative treatments including but not limited to: Acupuncture, Massage Therapy, Therapeutic Laser

Drenching: Drench guns may not be used in any stall/pen, aisle or walkway. Stomach pumping, drenching tubes or any other method (by esophagus) is prohibited.

9. Dogs/companion animals are not allowed on Show grounds. This rule will be strictly enforced and applies to all exhibitors and Show visitors. Exceptions are granted for dogs that are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with a disability.

10. Meals/Food

a. Each exhibitor will receive three meal tickets for breakfast on Sunday morning and three meal tickets for an additional meal. Additional guests can purchase food and drinks at the concession stand. The concession stand will be available throughout the day and will provide snacks and soft drinks for purchase.

Additional Information

- 1. Preprinted stall cards with your name and your donor's name will be distributed upon check-in.
- 2. You will be pre-stalled by club/chapter. If you are hauling calves with a different club/chapter, the Scramble office needs to know by November 1st.
- 3. Family is invited to attend.
- 4. Your donor will be invited to attend.
- 5. The Calf Scramble Greeters Judging Team will be available to give tips on the year-end essay and stall display projects.
