HILDEBRAND RURAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM VOCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

In 2026, the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo™ (the “Show”) will award up to \$6,000 Hildebrand Rural Scholars Program Vocational Scholarships to outstanding 4-H and/or FFA members exclusively from rural communities across Texas and who qualify for a Federal Pell Grant.

The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo's educational programs are a significant part of the Show's goals of benefiting youth, supporting education, and facilitating better agricultural practices through exhibitions and presentation. All recipients of Show scholarships must demonstrate academic potential, citizenship/leadership, and financial need, and they must attend a Texas school.

Recipients of the Hildebrand Rural Scholars Program Vocational Scholarship must attend an accredited Texas trade school program or junior college in pursuit of an Associate's Degree or certificate in a vocational field. Scholarships will be awarded to a maximum award of \$6,000 towards tuition, fees, and approved tools/supplies required for program completion.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible to apply for, or to be awarded, the scholarship, an applicant must:

1. Be a citizen of the United States. If the applicant's transcript reflects a place of birth other than the United States, appropriate proof of citizenship must be furnished (i.e. a copy of the photo page of a valid U. S. passport, a copy of Naturalization Certificate or a birth certificate for U. S. Citizen Born Abroad). Applications submitted without proof of citizenship will not be considered. Students with permanent resident status are not eligible to apply.
2. Be a Texas resident.
3. Attend a public, private, charter, or accredited home school.
4. Be a graduating senior in the 2025-2026 school year.
5. Be a current Texas 4-H or Texas FFA member. (CEA or AST to confirm membership.)
6. Be eligible to receive a Federal Pell Grant per the student's FAFSA Submission Summary.
7. Make their home residence on a farm/ranch, or in a Texas city with a population of less than 10,000 per the most recently available census data.
8. Meet GPA requirement of minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA (on an unweighted 4.0 scale) at the completion of the first semester (Fall 2025) of senior year. School official to provide verification of GPA.
9. Have made formal application to enroll with intent to attend an accredited Texas trade school or junior college and participate in a curriculum leading to an associate's degree or a certificate in a vocational field. Strictly online colleges and universities, even if they are not-for-profit, are not permitted.
10. Student may not apply to the Hildebrand Rural Scholars 4-Year Scholarship program.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Application Process:
 - a. Part 1 – Consists of completing the online application prior to the given deadline
 - b. Part 2 – Submission of School Official information prior to given deadline
2. Hildebrand Vocational Rural Scholars Program applications are only available online through the Show's website, www.rodeohouston.com, under the Scholarships and Grants area.
3. Students who receive last-dollar or full-ride scholarships or funding from other scholarship providers or universities do not qualify for the Hildebrand Rural Scholars Program. If selected to receive a Show scholarship, the applicant must provide verification of all other financial aid, grants or scholarships received. The scholarship award is not confirmed without such verification and failure to completely disclose all financial aid, or other scholarships shall deem the applicant ineligible to receive the scholarship award.
4. All required documentation will be uploaded during the application completion process. All documents must be submitted via the online application. No paper documents will be accepted. **Incomplete or late applications will not be accepted! There are no changes to submitted applications.**
5. Applicants are required to provide a school official's contact information for Part 2 of the application. The school official must be able to provide the applicant's GPA and official transcript. It is the applicant's responsibility to confirm that the school official listed can provide the required information by the stated guidelines. After submission, there are no changes to applications, including updating or changing information for the school official.
6. Applicants are required to provide their County Extension Agent or Agricultural Science Teacher's contact information for Part 2 of the application. The CEA or AST must confirm your membership in Texas 4-H or Texas FFA.
7. The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo recognizes the value of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in content creation and grammar checking. In partnership with Kaleidoscope, a scholarship administration partner, AI Detection and Plagiarism Checker tools are utilized with 99.12% accuracy. Consequently, any essays submitted as part of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Scholarship Application that contain **65% or more generative AI content will be disqualified** from the judging process and will not be considered for scholarship awards.

SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINES AND IMPORTANT DATES

It is the sole responsibility of each applicant and their parent/guardian to be aware of all dates and deadlines.

The Show will not accept or consider any incomplete or late applications. No exceptions will be made.

EVALUATION PROCEDURE

All completed applications will be reviewed and evaluated by a committee of judges selected by the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. Incomplete and non-qualifying applications will not be considered. Each application is scored based on academic achievement, high school leadership, activities, awards, community involvement, work experience, and financial need.

NOTIFICATION OF RECIPIENTS

Final approval and notification of each scholarship recipient will be made by the Show's Office of Educational Programs by the end of June 2026. Notifications are made via email.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Recipients will be expected to attend the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Scholarship Celebration to be held in Houston on July 11, 2026.

Applications and all documents will not be returned and become property of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo.

The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo has the right to refuse and/or retract any scholarship application or scholarship award during the judging, awarding or post awarding process. Refusal/retraction can be based on, but not limited to, nonfactual and incorrect information provided in the application or failure to meet any of the requirements.
